1989 - Kids Cafe - 2019

2019 marks the celebration of 30 years of Kids Cafe,

the third largest childhood hunger initiative in the United States. But, did you know it all started in Coastal Georgia?

Kids Cafe originated back in 1989 when two boys were found searching for food in a local community center. The police officers that discovered the boys, eating by the light of the refrigerator, soon realized it was because they had no food at home. The Savannah Morning News published an article about the boys' situation which prompted action by a group of concerned citizens. These citizens knew this was unacceptable in our country of plenty. As a grass roots program born out of necessity, local restaurants donated food that was picked up by volunteers and distributed to communities where lowincome children lived. Feeding America adopted the program and launched Kids Cafe as a national child feeding program in 1994.

As the need to feed hungry children continued to grow, Second Harvest partnered with the Savannah/Chatham School system in 2003 and was able to utilize a school kitchen for meal production. By 2006, Second Harvest was providing meals to approximately





650 children at 13 different locations. In 2009, the Second Harvest Board of Directors determined the need to build a commercial kitchen of our own in order to feed the children of Coastal Georgia. Grace's Kitchen, named after our gracious donor, the late Grace Neises, had its ribbon cutting in June 2011.

The most important components of our Kids Cafe program are that children are provided a hot meal, tutoring, and mentoring, in a supervised safe haven. Without fulfilling these four components, we cannot approve a site to participate in Kids Cafe.

America's Second Harvest's Kids Cafe program has grown to providing more than 3,700 meals each day during the school week at 80 different locations across 8 counties.

























VolunteerHub

We are so excited to introduce to you our new volunteer weblink provided by VolunteerHub. With the launch of this new software, we have been able to simplify the entire volunteer experience. Previously, we were manually processing and managing our volunteers which proved to be very time consuming and cumbersome to both our volunteers and Second Harvest. No longer do you have to call or email and patiently wait for a response. Just visit our website at helpendhunger.org, click on the Take Action tab and then select Volunteer on the dropdown menu. Once you are on our Volunteer page you can select Individual or Group.

Our new, user friendly weblink allows visitors who wish to volunteer the ability to view the dates, times of volunteer shifts available, location, and the number of open slots remaining to fill. Now, individuals are able to register an account, browse our volunteer opportunities, and sign up immediately, day or night directly from their computer.

Second Harvest depends tremendously on corporate, civic and scholastic groups to quickly and efficiently complete large volunteer tasks, such as packing Brown Bags for the Elderly or Mobile Food Pantry boxes. A group leader can contact our Volunteer Coordinator to reserve the desired amount of group space requested. The leader will then receive a link to a custom registration page for their group. VolunteerHub is capable of assisting group leaders by tracking who has signed up to attend and will send everyone in your volunteer group reminders.

With our new and improved, streamlined volunteer management system, we are able to spend less time sitting at a desk returning phone messages and emails and more time in the warehouse creating enjoyable volunteer opportunities. In comparison to the summer of 2018, our volunteer program has seen a 37.21% increase in volunteer hours for summer 2019 with the implementation of VolunteerHub! We believe that VolunteerHub is the technical support that our volunteer program desperately needs as we continue to grow and increase our volunteer opportunities.

Helping Hands in Grace's Kitchen

The saying "many hands make for light work" definitely rings true for Second Harvest and our Summer Feeding program. We would absolutely be "shorthanded" without the amazing staff of thirty volunteers who focused on the task at hand. Not only did they agree to take on the work of preparing 7,000 meals a day but they agreed to begin this daunting task at 6:30am, five days a week. The early bird shift for Summer Feeding volunteers ran for two months, June 3 – August 2. This amazing group of volunteers was equivalent to four full time kitchen staff.

Chef Sarah Maier stated, "What a gift it was to have pleasant, caring and reliable volunteers who gave of their time to help our chefs and staff to have a lighter load in the kitchen. With over 70 Summer Feeding sites, the logistics can be overwhelming but our wonderful volunteers were there each day to keep the momentum rolling and persevered to get all the meals out accurately and with heart."

Fight Hunger

One in eight Americans in communities across the U.S. struggle with hunger, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, but that number jumps to 1 in 5 for Coastal Georgia. To raise awareness and combat the issue, Walmart, Sam's Club, Feeding America and America's Second Harvest held the annual nationwide "Fight Hunger. Spark Change." campaign April 22 to May 20.
