Kids Cafe Celebrates 25 Years

139,847 children enrolled in school across our 21 county service area.

89,405 of those children are eligible for free/reduced lunch.

Second Harvest provides over 3,800 meals each day through 49 Kids Cafe Sites, a total of 595,927 hot meals distributed for the year.

Jewels and Jeans Thursday, April 23 Kids Cafe is a nationally recognized program designed to feed children at-risk for hunger who do not have access to an evening meal at home. Kids Cafe originated in Savannah twenty-five years ago and is now the second largest childhood hunger initiative in the United States which has grown to 2,426 sites feeding 154,910 children in 46 states.

Second Harvest of Coastal Georgia works in collaboration with other non-profits and faith-based organizations to provide hot, nutritious evening meals in addition to tutoring, mentoring, supervision and enrichment activities at forty-nine Kids Cafe locations. The Kids Cafe program is proven to increase participants' likelihood to stay in school until graduation. Additionally, children nourished with nutritious evening meals are strengthened and fortified to participate in both physical and academic activities.

\$340 - cost to feed a child for the school year. \$5,000 - cost to run a Kids Cafe site for the school year.
